About Opel Combo Electric Life XL 52 kWh (2024-...)

Overview

The 2025 Opel Combo-e XL 52 kWh is your go-to electric minivan for maximum space and practicality, hitting the European market with a price tag around €39,600 new. Produced since 2024, this XL version stretches out to offer cavernous room for families or businesses needing versatility, accommodating 5 or 7 seats. It's all about no-fuss electric mobility, packing a decent real-world range and a focus on utility. If you need to shift people or gear efficiently, this van-based MPV is a solid contender in the growing electric family hauler segment.

What's New for 2025?

For 2025, the Combo-e XL 52 kWh continues to rock the fresh updates from its recent facelift. This means it sports Opel's sharp "Vizor" front-end design, giving it a more modern and distinctive look. Inside, you'll find an upgraded infotainment system, often featuring a larger 10-inch touchscreen for a much-improved user experience. The key upgrade remains its improved battery pack offering better range and efficiency compared to older versions, making it a more compelling package for daily duties. Optional Intelli-Lux LED Matrix headlights are a neat tech addition.

Design & Exterior

The Combo-e XL cuts a practical, if boxy, figure, but the recent addition of Opel's sleek "Vizor" grille and updated headlights gives it a surprisingly modern face. As an XL, it's a sizeable beast, measuring 4760 mm in length, 1921 mm in width (excluding mirrors), and 1818 mm in height, promising serious interior volume. Its minivan silhouette clearly prioritizes space over swoopy lines. Sliding side doors are a massive boon for tight parking spots and easy passenger access, making it super family-friendly or ideal for loading gear.

Interior, Tech & Cargo

Step inside the Combo-e XL, and you're greeted by a cabin built for utility and space. With seating for 5 or 7, it's a proper people-mover. Materials are durable, ready for family life or work duties. Tech-wise, expect a functional infotainment system, often with a 10-inch touchscreen offering Apple CarPlay and Android Auto. The real party trick is the cargo space: a whopping 850 litres in the trunk, expanding to an enormous 2693 litres with seats folded. Sadly, there's no frunk for extra bits and bobs.

Performance & Driving Experience

Under the bonnet (well, floor), the Combo-e XL 52 kWh packs a single Permanent Magnet Synchronous Motor (PMSM) driving the front wheels. It delivers a sensible 100 kW of power and 270 Nm of torque. This translates to a 0-100 km/h sprint in 11.3 seconds and a top speed of 132 km/h – perfectly adequate for a family hauler. Expect a comfortable, easy-going drive rather than a sporty one. Regenerative braking helps claw back some energy, and its 750 kg braked towing capacity adds a dose of versatility.

Range, Battery & Charging

The Combo-e XL features a 50 kWh usable battery (52 kWh nominal), delivering a Green Cars Compare estimated real-world range of around 295 km. Its efficiency is rated at a decent 5.9 km/kWh. For charging, it comes with a standard 7.4 kW AC on-board charger, with an 11 kW version available optionally for faster

home top-ups (around 5 hours for a full charge with the 11 kW unit). On the go, it supports DC fast charging up to 100 kW via its CCS Type 2 port, meaning a 10-80% boost can take roughly 30 minutes.

Safety & Driver-Assistance Features

Safety is a key consideration, and the Opel Combo-e scores a respectable 4 stars from Euro NCAP. It comes equipped with a suite of driver-assistance systems to keep you on the straight and narrow. Standard kit usually includes essentials like automatic emergency braking with pedestrian detection, lane keep assist, and traffic sign recognition. You can often bolster this with optional extras such as adaptive cruise control for more relaxed motorway journeys, blind-spot monitoring, and a handy parking camera system to navigate this spacious XL variant.

Warranty & Maintenance Coverage

Opel typically backs the Combo-e XL with a 2-year, unlimited-kilometre manufacturer warranty across Europe, which is pretty standard. Crucially for an EV, the high-voltage battery is covered for 8 years or 160,000 km, guaranteeing at least 70% of its original capacity – giving peace of mind. Powertrain components often align with the main vehicle warranty. While complimentary maintenance isn't always standard, Opels are generally known for reasonable upkeep costs. Regular servicing will focus on checks rather than extensive mechanical work thanks to its simpler electric powertrain.

How powerful is it? How fast does it accelerate?

The Opel Combo Electric Life XL 52 kWh (2024-...) achieves a 0 to 60 mph acceleration in 10.9 seconds (placing it at [Nº90 out of 119 ranked positions](#), among 979 electric vehicles, with some cars sharing positions) and attains a maximum speed of 82 mph.

Its powertrain provides a power output of up to 100 kW (134 hp) and a torque of 199 lb-ft.

How far can it go on single charge? What is the real-world range?

Opel Combo Electric Life XL 52 kWh (2024-...) achieves a real-world range of 183 miles, placing it at [Nº189 among 266 ranked positions](#). However, this range is subject to several influences:

- Speed: Traveling at higher speeds reduces battery life.
- Temperature: Extreme cold or hot weather can affect range.
- Terrain: Hilly or mountainous landscapes decrease range.
- Driving habits: Aggressive driving with frequent acceleration and braking consumes more energy.
- Feature usage: Climate control and media systems also influence range.

It's important to acknowledge that these are estimations, and your actual driving range may differ. Consider these factors when planning your trip and be ready for potential charging stops.

What charging options are available? How long does it take to charge it?

The Opel Combo Electric Life XL 52 kWh (2024-...) in the USA comes with a CCS Type 2 charging port. It can be charged at home using a standard domestic socket or at any public AC charging station with the compatible cable. It's important to note that the car's on-board charger (inverter) limits the maximum AC

charging rate to 7.4 kW, resulting in approximately 24 miles of range added per hour of charging.

For significantly faster charging, public DC fast-charging stations are available. Although the car can achieve a maximum DC charging rate of 100 kW, factors such as battery temperature and charge level may affect the actual charging speed.

How big is it? What are the dimensions (length, width, height)?

The size and weight specifications for Opel Combo Electric Life XL 52 kWh (2024-...) are as follows:

How much cargo space does it offer? Does it have a front trunk?

The rear cargo area of the Opel Combo Electric Life XL 52 kWh (2024-...) provides 30 cubic feet of space when the rear seats are upright ([Nº26 out of 166 ranked positions](#), among 979 electric vehicles, with some cars sharing positions).

Folding these seats down unlocks a maximum cargo capacity of 95.1 cubic feet ([Nº22 out of 201 ranked positions](#), among 979 electric vehicles, with some cars sharing positions).

The car doesn't have a "frunk" (front trunk).

Is it suitable for towing? What is the maximum towing capacity?

The Opel Combo Electric Life XL 52 kWh (2024-...) is officially rated to tow 1653 lbs. This applies to trailers equipped with brakes.
