About BYD Seal Comfort RWD (2025-...)

Overview

The 2025 BYD Seal Comfort RWD slides into the electric sedan scene, ready to give established rivals a run for their money! This entry-level model packs a stylish punch with BYD's "Ocean Aesthetics," offering a taste of rear-wheel-drive fun. It aims to blend premium feel with accessible electric motoring. In Europe, you can snag this sleek machine starting from €41,690 new. It's a compelling package for those dipping their toes into premium EVs, offering a distinct alternative in a crowded market, promising both good looks and decent electric performance without breaking the bank.

What's New for 2025?

For 2025, the BYD Seal range expands in Europe with the introduction of this keenly priced Comfort RWD trim. This specific variant makes its debut, bringing the Seal's distinctive design and EV tech to a wider audience. It's all about offering a more accessible entry point into the Seal family, without skimping too much on the core experience. Expect the latest BYD infotainment software and potentially refined suspension tunes for European roads, ensuring this new model is fresh and competitive right out of the gate for the current model year.

Design & Exterior

The BYD Seal Comfort RWD is a real head-turner, rocking BYD's "Ocean Aesthetics" design language. It's seriously sleek and aerodynamic, looking poised even at a standstill. Cool U-shaped headlights and a full-width rear light bar give it a distinctive signature. This sedan measures 4800 mm in length, 1875 mm in width (excluding mirrors), and stands 1460 mm tall. While it's the entry trim, it doesn't skimp on style, boasting sharp lines and an athletic stance that will definitely get you noticed.

Interior, Tech & Cargo

Step inside the Seal Comfort RWD, and you're greeted by a properly modern cabin. The star of the show is BYD's signature rotating 15.6-inch infotainment screen, which is slick and responsive, handling your tunes and nav with flair, including Apple CarPlay and Android Auto. There's space for five, and materials feel pretty plush for this segment. Luggage-wise, you get a decent 400 litres in the boot, plus a handy 53-litre frunk under the bonnet for your charging cables. Overall, it's a tech-forward and comfortable place to be.

Performance & Driving Experience

The Comfort RWD isn't shy on performance, zipping from 0 to 100 km/h in a respectable 7.5 seconds. Its single Permanent Magnet Synchronous Motor (PMSM) at the rear delivers a punchy 170 kW of power and 380 Nm of instant torque, making city driving and overtakes a breeze. Being rear-wheel drive, it promises some engaging handling characteristics, likely balanced with a comfortable ride suitable for daily commutes. Expect smooth power delivery and multiple regenerative braking modes to fine-tune your driving experience and claw back some energy.

Range, Battery & Charging

Under the floor, the Seal Comfort RWD packs a 61.4 kWh usable LFP Blade battery. Green Cars Compare calculates a real-world range of around 391 km, with an efficiency of 6.37 km/kWh, which is pretty solid.

For charging, its CCS Type 2 port handles up to 11 kW AC, meaning a full top-up at home will take around 5-6 hours. Out and about, DC fast charging peaks at 110 kW, getting you from 30% to 80% in about 30 minutes. V2L (Vehicle-to-Load) capability is also on board!

Safety & Driver-Assistance Features

Safety is a big deal for BYD, and the Seal proudly wears a 5-star Euro NCAP rating. The Comfort RWD trim comes loaded with a comprehensive suite of standard driver-assistance systems. You can expect features like adaptive cruise control to take the strain off long journeys, lane keep assist to keep you centred, blind-spot monitoring for safer lane changes, and autonomous emergency braking. This tech works together to provide an extra pair of eyes and a reassuring sense of security on every drive.

Warranty & Maintenance Coverage

BYD typically offers a solid warranty package in Europe. For the Seal Comfort RWD, expect a general vehicle warranty around 6 years or 150,000 km. The crucial LFP Blade battery is likely covered for 8 years or 200,000 km, with a guarantee against significant degradation (often 70% state of health). Powertrain components usually fall under a similar robust warranty. While specifics on complimentary maintenance can vary by market, BYD's reputation for battery longevity and overall reliability is a strong point for peace of mind.

How powerful is it? How fast does it accelerate?

The BYD Seal Comfort RWD (2025-...) achieves a 0 to 60 mph acceleration in 7.2 seconds (placing it at [Nº56 out of 120 ranked positions](#), among 1014 electric vehicles, with some cars sharing positions) and attains a maximum speed of 137 mph.

Its powertrain provides a power output of up to 170 kW (228 hp) and a torque of 280 lb-ft.

How far can it go on single charge? What is the real-world range?

BYD Seal Comfort RWD (2025-...) achieves a real-world range of 243 miles, placing it at [Nº140 among 272 ranked positions](#). However, this range is subject to several influences:

- Speed: Traveling at higher speeds reduces battery life.
- Temperature: Extreme cold or hot weather can affect range.
- Terrain: Hilly or mountainous landscapes decrease range.
- Driving habits: Aggressive driving with frequent acceleration and braking consumes more energy.
- Feature usage: Climate control and media systems also influence range.

It's important to acknowledge that these are estimations, and your actual driving range may differ. Consider these factors when planning your trip and be ready for potential charging stops.

What charging options are available? How long does it take to charge it?

The BYD Seal Comfort RWD (2025-...) in the USA comes with a CCS Type 2 charging port. It can be charged at home using a standard domestic socket or at any public AC charging station with the compatible cable. It's important to note that the car's on-board charger (inverter) limits the maximum AC

charging rate to 11 kW, resulting in approximately 39 miles of range added per hour of charging.

For significantly faster charging, public DC fast-charging stations are available. Although the car can achieve a maximum DC charging rate of 110 kW, factors such as battery temperature and charge level may affect the actual charging speed.

How big is it? What are the dimensions (length, width, height)?

The size and weight specifications for BYD Seal Comfort RWD (2025-...) are as follows:

- Length: 189 in
- Width: 84.6 in (including side mirrors) or 73.8 in (excluding side mirrors)
- Height: 57.5 in
- Wheelbase: 115 in (distance between the center of the front and rear wheels)
- Curb weight: 4370 lbs (weight of the empty car, no people or cargo)

How much cargo space does it offer? Does it have a front trunk?

The rear cargo area of the BYD Seal Comfort RWD (2025-...) provides 14.1 cubic feet of space when the rear seats are upright ([Nº118 out of 170 ranked positions](#), among 1014 electric vehicles, with some cars sharing positions).

Folding these seats down unlocks a maximum cargo capacity of cubic feet ([Nº out of ranked positions](#), among 1014 electric vehicles, with some cars sharing positions).

In addition, the car has a frunk, a front compartment with 1.9 cubic feet dedicated to smaller items.

Is it suitable for towing? What is the maximum towing capacity?

The BYD Seal Comfort RWD (2025-...) is officially rated to tow 1653 lbs. This applies to trailers equipped with brakes.
